#### New Faculty Spotlight: Tierney Lorenz, Ph.D.

Dr. Lorenz is a clinical scientist and health psychologist with a specialty in female sexual and reproductive health. She was most recently in the Department of Psychological Science at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, where she was the Director of the Women, Immunity, and Sexual Health (WISH) Lab. She completed her doctoral training at the University of Texas at Austin and clinical residency at the University of Washington School of Medicine with a specialty in Behavioral Medicine. She also completed a postdoctoral Fellowship at the Kinsey Institute, with a focus on psychoendoneuro--immunology (the ultimate Scrabble word!). Her research addresses the interactions between women's mental, physical and sexual wellbeing, trying to understand how to help women with





mental and physical health conditions have happy, healthy sexual lives and in turn, how sexual behavior may influence women's mental and physical health. Her research on how sexual activity alters healthy women's immune function was recently featured in both the New York Times and Playboy magazine. Clinically, she specializes in treatment of sexual dysfunction in survivors of sexual trauma, and in women with mood disorders - particularly those taking antidepressants.

- **❖** This year, the Psychological Consultation Center (PCC) served 176 clients who were seen for an average of 8 sessions.
- More than two-thirds of clients utilized the sliding scale fees at the PCC, paying as little as five dollars per session.
- ❖ Although the PCC does serve UNL students, 85% of PCC clients are from the larger community of southeastern Nebraska.
